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## First Steps

#### PRE-ARRIVAL

- Contact your sponsor and complete all documents required by your new command (NOTE: Review your PPCs closely)
- Reserve Lodging at the <u>Hodja Inn</u>, or other approved lodging (GSUs only), if your sponsor has not already done so
- Military: Hand-carry 5 copies of your <u>BLUE STAMPED</u> NATO orders, CAC ID, PCS orders and have them ready for travel
- Civilian: Have your Red, no-fee passport, DEROS
   Letter from CPO, CAC ID & Visa ready for travel
- Military & Civilian: Your Blue Tourist Passport is not mandatory, but is highly encouraged, especially if you plan to travel around the AOR or if your travel termi- nates in another country other than the U.S. or Türki-ye (i.e. Ramstein)
- If you wish to stay for 24 months instead of the initial 12-month tour, you may apply for the Turkey Assignment Incentive Pay (TAIP) program. Contact your CSS or MPF for further details.
- If traveling via commercial aircraft, check with your airline for prohibited items.
- Keep your original, <u>BLUE STAMPED</u> NATO orders secure. You will need these each time you exit/enter the country. If you misplace them, the MPF/PERSCO Team can assist with replacement
- Your installation TMO can assist with understanding your travel entitlements and shipping your HHGs. NOTE: HHGs can take 2 months or longer to arrive, for items you need within 30 days of arrival, ask your TMO about unaccompanied baggage.

# TEMPORARY RESIDENCY FOR CIVILIANS

- For civilian employees and visitors, check evisa requirements at evisa.gov.tr/en.
- After 90 days, civilian DoD employees must apply for residency in Türkiye for the duration of their contract. The process can be done at Pass and ID in Bldg. 833.

#### **MONEY**

- Determine any entitlements with the Finance Office upon arrival.
- Bring a checkbook to get cash from the cash cage in Bldg. 833.

NOTE: To save on ATM fees, bring a checkbook to withdraw money at the CPTS cash cage. ATMs dispense Turkish lira, U.S. dollars or euro, but can occasionally run out of cash or malfunction, so having a checkbook is advised to withdraw cash.

- ♦ Setup online bill-pay and banking options.
- Change direct deposit information for your pay and bills if closing a checking or savings account.
- Put a travel advisory on your cards, so your transactions are not automatically declined.
- It's always best to carry Turkish lira and U.S. dollars when off installation. Some places take card off base, but not always.
- There is often fluctuation with the exchange rate with several lira to the dollar, so be aware of the difference in the currency's worth.

# Shipping HHGs & POV

#### TYPES OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS

- ♦ Household Goods (HHG): Shipped by vessel and can take three to four months to arrive. When shipping household goods, E-1 to E-4 are entitled to 10% of their full weight entitlement. Service members E-5 and above, as well as ALL officers are allowed 2,500 lbs. or 25% of the full HHG weight allowance, whichever is greater. Civilian employees are limited to 4,500 lbs of HHG. Motorcycles are authorized to be shipped as HHGs.
- Non Temporary Storage (NTS): Any items you have put into NTS will be sent to a warehouse in the states for the duration of your overseas tour. Consider putting any large appliances, large power tools, microwaves etc. into storage. Access to these items while in government paid storage will not be possible. Store items as appropriate to your needs.
- Unaccompanied Baggage (UB): a smaller shipment of household items you want available to you sooner than when your HHG shipment will arrive. It will arrive prior to your HHG shipment. If shipping UB, all enlisted personnel are entitled to 500 lbs. Officers O-1 to O-5 are entitled to 600 lbs and O-6 to O-10 are entitled to 700 lbs. Civilian employees are entitled to 500 lbs.
- Each shipment will be picked up by a different company. It is recommended that while you are packing you separate and clearly mark which shipment is which.

#### RECOMMENDED PACKING LIST

#### **Ship Ahead**

- Bedding, sheets, and blankets the Base Exchange carries these items but supplies are limited
- ♦ Mattress Pad
- ♦ Shower curtain

#### In your Luggage

- ♦ Weather appropriate clothing
- Uniforms (i.e. OCPs, PTUs, Service Dress)
- ♦ Two week supply of hygiene items

#### **Unaccompanied Baggage**

- ♦ Cooking items (i.e. plates, cutlery, cookware)
- ♦ TV & Gaming Systems —Cable is in all residential areas and AFN is included
- ♦ Additional clothing/uniform items
- ♦ Sports equipment , bikes, or skateboards
- ♦ Bath and Hand Towels
- ♦ Bath Mats, shower curtains, and rings
- ♦ Screwdrivers and other small tools
- ♦ Small appliances

**LOAN LOCKER:** The M&FRC has loan lockers (i.e. cooking utensils, irons, small appliances) available for use while you are waiting for your household goods to arrive.

# Shipping HHGs & POV

#### SHIPPING YOUR POV

POVs are now authorized at Incirlik AB! One POV is authorized for persons O-1, E-7, GS-5, and above regardless of tour length. Additionally, E-5 and E-6 personnel serving tour lengths of 24 months or longer are authorized shipment of one POV. <a href="DEFENSE TRANSPORTATION REGULATION - PART IV">DEFENSE TRANSPORTATION REGULATION - PART IV</a>, PERSONAL PROPERTY: ATTH K3, SHIPPING YOUR POV

NOTE: Take note of VPC turn in requirements. For instance, they may not accept your car at the VPC if it has a lot of dirt on the outside or inside—getting it detailed prior to shipping is recommended. Be sure your gas tank is less than ¼ full, or this could delay the turn-in process. Documents required at the VPC: your registration, PCS orders, Pre-Shipping/Storage Instruction Form, and Shipper Acknowledgement Form, Driver's License or CAC.

#### **RECEIVING YOUR POV**

- The Turkish Air Force 10th Tanker Base Command requires a particular type of insurance, for instance, to obtain a vehicle pass and gain on-base driving privileges.
- ♦ Turkish Law requires drivers to have a NATO Smart Card and Turkish Insurance.
- The process can take up to 3 months once the vehicle arrives and can come at a personal, non -reimbursable cost of up to \$1,000.
- ♦ Review the How-To Guide in it's entirety before you decide if bringing your POV is right for you.

#### REGISTERING YOUR VEHICLE

Stop by the Pass & ID office, 1st Floor, Bldg 833 to begin the process for registering your vehicle. DSN 314-676-3882, Comm +90-322-316-3882

- Apply for your <u>NATO Smart Card</u> (Pg.10), this is needed for your tax exemption
- Obtain 3 copies of your Beyanname Forms from TMO
- ♦ In addition to your completed "Tax Exemption Work Form", "Advanced POV Registration Form", and AF Form 533, bring 2 copies blackstamped NATO orders, 2 copies of PCS orders, 3 copies of your passport, and 2 passport size photos
- Pass & ID will facilitate transport to the Tax Office & Pubic Notary; bring 1,926TL, your passport , Beyanname paperwork, & a photo/ weight of your POV
- Once your package is complete, Pass & ID will facilitate a meeting with a Broker to schedule POV delivery to your residence

# Shipping HHGs & POV

#### HOUSEHOLD GOODS ARRIVAL

The Traffic Management Office (TMO) will assist you with passenger travel and delivery of your household goods (HHG). Things to keep in mind to prepare you for delivery:

- Once you have your orders, email
   39lrs.lgrdf.ppo@us.af.mil for a personal property
   worksheet. Fill it out and email it back to them.
- During the Newcomer's Briefing, you will sign a Power of Attorney for your goods with the Legal office, who will notarize it. This is for Turkish Customs, so they can clear your goods once it arrives.
- Upon receiving the 'Offer for Shipment Delivery' sheet via email from the carrier (check your spam & junk mail), stop by the Personal Property TMO office with the following documentation:
  - 1. 5 copies of NATO stamped orders
  - 2. 4 copies of PCS orders
  - 3. HHG POA
  - 4. Offer for Shipment Delivery Sheet
- Once your HHGs arrive, a Beyanname will be created by the Customs Liaison Office, which includes high-value items that you have brought with you. Any item on this list you must keep for the duration of your time in Türkiye, even if it is damaged.
- Once you receive and inventory your items, if there are missing or broken items, make a claim through DPS. See <u>PERSONAL PROPERTY CLAIMS</u> <u>FACT SHEET</u>.

#### WHAT IS BEYANNAME?

A beyaname is a written customs declaration between the service member and the Government of Turkey that provides customs control of high value items brought into Turkey. Members are required to list all their Beyaname items when your receive your HHG. Contact the Incirlik Personal Property office for more guidance

Members will be asked to verify their inventory list alongside the carrier at the time of delivery. The items identified, will be added to your Beyanname.

Contact the Legal Office if you wish to sell an item on your Beyanname or if the item was stolen. If you do not have the listed items when you out-process, you will need to pay a fine of up to five times the value of the item due to Turkish black market laws.

#### WHAT IS CONSIDERED BEYANNAME?

According to Turkish Customs regulations, there are 11 specific Beyanname items not limited to:

- ♦ Televisions, computers, or DVD Unit
- ♦ Stereo & Video Cassette Recorder
- Air Conditioners
- Washers, dryers, and Dish Washers
- Refrigerators, Deep Freezers and Microwave Ovens
- Also includes: POVs, motorcycles, bicycles, furniture, and any household item valued over 300 USD.

# Bringing Your Pet to Turkiye

## WHO IS AUTHORIZED TO BRING PETS?

- Only those who live in single occupancy housing are allowed to bring their pets (i.e. E-6/O-4 and above) or dual military stationed at Incirlik.
- ♦ Each household is allowed 2 pets maximum.
- ♦ Dogs and cats are the only approved animals.
- Please contact your sponsor to confirm if you will qualify for single occupancy housing.
- All other ranks are allowed a maximum 25-gallon aquarium that can only house fish.

#### TRAVELING WITH PETS

Turkey has very stringent rules and requirements for importing your pet. Please refer to the FAQs and ensure you are following all Host Nation laws when preparing to travel.

For further guidance, please visit the <u>Animal and Plant</u> Health Inspection Service (APHIS) under the USDA.

Review the "Know before you PCS—Pet Owner Guide" Informational Packet before you decide if bringing your pet is right for you and your family.

Currently, if you're traveling with pets, only commercial travel is possible. Some, but not all, costs associated with moving your pet are reimbursable. Verify with your local TMO office on the latest guidance.

\*\*Turkey is a high risk rabies location and Incirlik is home to many wild and stray cats and dogs. Although they are marked with a green chip, U.S. Servicemembers and US DOD Civilians are not to pet or feed them.

#### PET REGISTRATION

- Within 10 days of arrival to Incirlik, all pets must be registered in the Veterinary Treatment Facility (VTF)
- Pets are required to have a valid rabies vaccine/ certificate and microchip prior to registration at the Incirlik VTF
- ♦ Bring the following documents to the Incirlik VTF: Your DOD ID Card
  - Pet's Health Certificate (issued by previous veterinarian)
  - Valid Rabies Certificate and vaccine records

    Proof of ISO compatible microchip
- All clients will need to review and sign the Incirlik VTF Client Policy Letter and fill out a Pet Registration Form
- Pets do not need to be present during initial registration

#### PETCARE, GROOMING &

#### **BOARDING**

- Limited services are available at the Incirlik VTF, by appointment only.
- A list of off-base vet clinics is provided for your in the Pet Owner Guide.
- The Commissary has limited pet food and supplies and shipping food via P.O. Box can take up to two weeks
- Currently there are no Pet Boarding or Grooming facilities available on Incirlik (COMING SOON!)

## **Housing & Dorms**

#### **HOUSING**

- ♦ Email the Housing Management Office at Incirlikuh.managers@us.af.mil so they can let you know how to prepare for housing in-processing.
- It is highly recommended to obtain renter's insurance whether living in the dorms or homes on base to cover potential damages or loss to personal property.
- ♦ Local housing offices are able to assist members from Geographically Separated Units (GSUs) with finding a local residence.

#### HOME HEADS UP

♦ You may need power converters/transformers to use your U.S. electronics in your home.

Dual voltage will be labeled with a range like this on electronics: 100-240V. In this case, you only need a plug converter. Other items that are labeled 120V will require a transformer, which is a small plug-in box that converts the voltage to safely use your single voltage equipment. Some items, like hair clippers and electronics with certain motors, may be may be damaged or unusable even when using a transformer. This is due to the difference in electrical frequency, measured in hertz (50 Hz in Türkiye as opposed to 60 Hz in the U.S.), so it is sometimes best to buy a 220V replacement for the duration of your time in country.

Base houses contain basic furnishings which cannot be thrown away or sold. All furniture supplied will need to be in the house at move out and is marked with a barcode.

#### **ON-BASE HOUSING**

All personnel live on base. Accommodations on base are based on availability, rank, career field and TAIP incentives.

#### LODGING ACCOMMODATIONS

Dorms may be ready for move-in upon arrival for service members E-1 to E-4. Please keep in mind that some items, such as linens, are not always provided. The Hodja Inn is ready to serve when members step off the plane and while waiting for availability on a house or a dorm. It is highly recommended to obtain renters insurance to cover potential loss or damage to your belongings.

#### **NEIGHBORHOODS**

#### There are four housing neighborhoods:

- Phantom Housing: 3-4 bedrooms, E-5 (with roommate) or 2 bedrooms for E-6 (single)
- ♦ Herky Studio Apartments: E-6 (single)
- Falcon Housing: Civilians, E-7 to E-9 (single)
- ♦ Eagle Housing: 4 bedrooms, O-1 to O-3 (with roommate) or O-4 to O-6 (single)

### **Housing & Dorms**

#### **DORMS**

As part of the Newcomer's Briefing, the Dorm Manager will assist members in filling out paperwork and getting familiarized with your new home. Dorms vary in floor plan and can include a shared kitchen or bathroom, with laundry rooms on each floor or a single laundry room on the first floor. Airman utilizing

TAIP can move into Bldg. 960.

- ♦ Grills are available outside the dorms.
- Electric scooter charging stations are available, but be sure to secure your property as you are liable for loss or theft.

Contact your Dorm Mayor for access to your room if you are locked out. If there are still issues with access, please call 676-4357.

#### **TELEVISION SERVICE**

#### **American Forces Network (AFN)**

- Provides programming from current networks and prime channels.
- Download the AFN Now mobile app from Android and Apple App Stores, or install the Smart TV application on your Amazon Fire TV Stick, Apple TV, Android TV or Roku.

#### **Other Streaming Services**

Examples—Amazon Prime, Netflix, Hulu

Show variety and availability may be limited due to geographical location, so a virtual private network (VPN) service is recommended to access U.S. programming.



### **Once You Arrive**

#### **ARRIVAL**

- At Incirlik AB, your unit's CSS must sign you up for the Newcomer's Briefing with the Military & Family Readiness Center (M&FRC), located in Bldg. 833. The M&FRC can advise on items required for the briefing, including travel documents and receipts.
- During the Newcomer's Briefing, you will inprocess with Finance and TRICARE Overseas and get familiarized with base agencies. Bring several copies of your orders as they will be needed to process your paperwork.
- Legal will assist with Power of Attorney (POA) documents required for receiving HHGs
- The briefing will end with personnel getting equipped with gear. The bus will then drop off service members to current accommodations (Hodja Inn, housing or dorms).

#### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

- ♦ Update your AtHoc information.
- Fire Safety and Extinguisher Hands-On Training needs to be done within 30 days of arrival per Incirlik AB Instruction 32-2001. Call 676-3021 to sign up.

#### **ACTIVATE YOUR P.O. BOX**

As soon as you arrive, stop by the "Official Document Center" (aka Post Office) to activate your P.O. Box and register your CAC ID in AMPS.

#### **NATO SMART CARD**

Once you arrive, you will need to visit Pass & ID (Bldg 833) to apply for your NATO Smart Card for base access and vehicle registration. TurAF will only issue a temporary 2-week gate pass. Bring with you:

- ♦ NATO Orders
- ♦ PCS Orders
- ♦ CAC ID
- Oriver's License

#### STAY CONNECTED

- ♦ TitanNet Wi-Fi is available at various locations across the base.
- ♦ BaseFIX in the Exchange Mobile Center

BaseFIX can assist with WiFi connection to the local Turk Telekom lines for your residence. Located in the BX next to the electronics, they typically have a turnaround between 24 hours to a week for service activation, depending on the demand. You can re-load minutes and pay bills at the counter, or you can take advantage of online bill pay with a credit card.

Pre-paid phone plans are available with Turk-Cell, purchase pay-as-you-go hot spots and sign up for internet packages at various speeds.

## **Transportation**





Scooters, motorbikes, bicycles, e-bikes & cargo bikes are common methods of transportation on base.

#### PRIVATELY OWNED VEHICLES

POVs are now authorized at Incirlik AB for MSgt and Above! Review the How-To Guide in it's entirety before you decide if bringing your POV is right for you.

#### THINGS TO KNOW

- The 39 LRS provides transportation to and from the Adana Airport for official travel.
- ♦ A 24-hour shuttle bus is available every 30 minutes, in each direction around the base. Call the shuttle bus for pick up at 676-6756.
- It is also highly encouraged for members to ship or purchase a bicycle for personal transportation.

#### **SCOOTERS & E-BIKES**

Motorbikes, e-bikes and bicycles can be purchased new or used at the Auto Hobby Shop in Bldg. 1060 (DSN 676-6655), from vendors next to the BX or on a Facebook group called Incirlik Scooter Mart 2.0. Check in with the Safety Office or your command's scooter safety representative after arrival to receive training on scooter safety. A helmet and closed-toed shoes are required. NOTE: Scooters cannot be shipped.

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

- If renting a car, it must be registered with the base. Ask your sponsor about the current cost of renting a vehicle and recommended companies.
- You can also register scooters and motorbikes you intend to use on base.
- At Incirlik AB, the 39th Logistics Readiness Squadron (LRS) provides transportation to and from the Adana Airport for official travel.
- Service members are highly encouraged to ship or purchase a bicycle for personal transportation.

#### **FUELING YOUR TRANSPORTATION**

There is a shoppette with a two-pump gas station, open daily from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. Some dorms offer parking areas for electric scooters with charging capabilities.

### Medical

#### **FIRST STEPS**

- Add emergency numbers to cell phone contacts
- ♦ Civilian personnel should establish contact with their civilian insurance provider.
- Get an initial appointment to renew any prescriptions and medical care w th your new Primary Care Manager (PCM) or care team.
- ♦ Enroll in TRICARE Online Secure Messaging.
- Download MyCare Overseas mobile app with TRICARE and SOS International can help you find providers off base for specialty care.

#### **INCIRLIK MEDICAL CARE**

The 39th Medical Group (MDG) serves Incirlik AB with routine medical and dental patient needs in Bldg. 865 between D and E Street.

#### **PLEASE NOTE**

Always carry a list of medications and allergies as well as your insurance card and ID card. Pregnant service members at Incirlik AB must PCS to a new location by 24 weeks for care. Overseas follow-on assignments may be cancelled.

## TREATMENT DIFFERENCES OFF INSTALLATION

While there may be some cultural and treatment differences in Türkiye, rest assured that the medical standard of care you receive is the highest quality. Although there are a few differences in medical practices, the 39 MDG staff collaborate with the host nation medical partners, ensuring a positive outcome and experience for all patients. Local hospitals do accept TRICARE.

#### CIVILIAN MEDICAL CARE

Preferred Network Facilities for Civilians are not supported. Adana hospitals do not accept civilian insurance. Some insurance providers will reimburse individuals for out-of-pocket costs, but this should be discussed with the insurance provider before seeking care.
